Dr. Vivien Lee is the chief psychologist for the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) and bureau commander of the OPP Healthy Workplace Team. In this role, she oversees a Bureau with a mandate to support OPP members, families, retirees and auxiliary officers. Dr. Lee previously worked as a staff psychologist at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH) in the Psychological Trauma Program/Work, Stress and Health Program before founding the Centre for Trauma Recovery and Growth (CTRG). She has been the clinical advisor for Boots on the Ground— Ontario since it was founded in 2018, and she is a board director and former clinical advisor for Toronto Beyond the Blue. Dr. Lee serves on the Psychological Services Committee of the Canadian Association Chiefs of Police (CACP). She previously worked as a clinician and clinical advisor for Wounded Warriors Canada. Dr. Lee has previously served as a board director on the Public Services Health and Safety Association (PSHSA), chair of the Service Provider Reference Group with the Atlas Institute for Veterans and Families, the Service Delivery Working Group for the 988 crisis and suicide prevention line in Canada, and as an ex-officio member of the Traumatic Stress Section of the Canadian Psychological Association. She earned her honours bachelor of science degree from the University of Toronto and master's and Ph.D. degrees in clinical psychology from Western University. Dr. Lee is a graduate of the University of Toronto—Rotman School of Management Police Leadership Program.
