After AstraMerck, Dr. Massey held senior management positions at Quintiles and AstraZeneca. In 2011, Dr. Massey became the Jack Martin M.D. Research Professor of Psychopharmacology at Vanderbilt University, where he conducted research into the genetics, biological basis and pharmacological treatment of schizophrenia and serious mental illness.
